

CityLinC is a non-profit, faith-based organization in Battle Creek whose primary mission is to help high-risk children and their families in times of crisis and transition.

# Women's Life Recovery Program

The Women's Life Recovery Program (WLRP) is a faith-based program to help women overcome addictions while identifying self-defeating behaviors and maximizing their potential to live and work in the community. It is part of the Haven of Rest Ministries. It began in 2013 as a residential program but due to difficulty in obtaining grant funding for substance abuse, it is now a day program. WLRP is housed in a building owned by Rhema Word Outdoor Center. WLRP is using this building rent free but pays the utilities.

This ministry was created to keep families together through recovery. Services available are individual and group therapy, spiritual counseling, life skill classes, relapse prevention, referrals to community resources, and physical fitness. The program is a 9-12 month commitment, with support continuing for as long as needed. There are approximately 16-20 women of all ages in each class with no charge for the program.

Our Benevolence budget has supported this program since its beginning. Our Sanctuary Project now allows us to add them as a "mission focus." We will be providing them the opportunity to use our facilities, work with our volunteers, and receive additional financial support for their programs.

Another Caravan is in the books. For 2018 we headed to Lewisburg, West Virginia. The six high-schoolers, one college student, and three adults on the team spent the week working on a house in Rurpert,

WV. This was another house that was damaged during the 2016 flood. We put up siding and put in a wheelchair ramp on the front of the house.

All of the students used power tools. For some, it was their first time. Our project manager, Gary Ratliff, did an amazing job teaching the kids how to use them safely. Gary also had his home damaged in the flood, he's been rebuilding while working on other 's homes.

We finished our projects by Thursday, so on Friday we worked at Gary's house. We put shelving on his barn so he had a place to sort out materials for the various projects. (See cover picture) It was really great that we were able to help him out.

On Wednesday, Gary showed us around the area. We started at Bear Town Nature Park with a lot of limestone caves and canyons to see. Next, we headed to Droop Mountain Battlefield, a Civil War site with a really neat museum and a tower from which you could see a long way. Then we headed to the Falls of Hill Creek. There were three waterfalls to see and 400 steps to climb. We finished the day at the city pool. On Thursday we had a karaoke night at the church. There are some awesome videos of this with lots of laughter by the audience. On Saturday we explored the Lost World Caverns. At one point we were twelve stories underground!

It was a fantastic week. It was really fun to see the group come together as a team. The kids all did an amazing job. I want to say thanks to my adult leaders Jim Hoglen, and Kathy Baker and also to our college student Josh Liechty. You made my job a lot easier. I am really looking forward to what happens next year.
