### NOTES FROM THE MAY MEETING OF SESSION

Carl McCune, Clerk of Session

A motion prevailed to hire Mary Christian as a Part-Time (up to 24 hours/week) Office Assistant.

A motion prevailed approving a resolution of support for a newly formed Safety Steering Committee. Its purpose is to develop a proposal to present to Session regarding strategy, structure, recruitment, training and equipment needed. A motion prevailed approving a request from our Cub Scout Pack 301 to begin recruiting girls in September. They would be in a separate Den with appropriate female leadership. The Cub Scouts on a national level will make this change to allow recruitment of girls beginning on June 1, 2018. The Scouting Representative will report back to Session in the fall following the recruitment period.

A motion prevailed approving the Benevolence Committee recommendation to designate the Mission Component of the Sanctuary Refurbishment Campaign in the following way: \$6,000 toward creating a relationship with Safe Place, \$6,000 toward creating a relationship with the Women's Life Recovery program and \$500 set aside for an emergency contingency fund.

A motion prevailed approving a resolution of thanks and great appreciation to Tom Till for leading the confirmation program for our six confirmands.

Membership Update New members joining the church by confession of faith on May 13, 2018 were Katelyn Allen, Ada Compton, Justin LaFleur, Halaina Peevers, Marcus Peevers and Nichelle Wood. Current Active Membership is 313. Trustees An internal financial review of church accounting procedures was completed.

Board Reorganization Task Force A motion prevailed to accept the Task Force request to delay their reporting until October 8.

Appreciation was expressed for the service of Mary Burg, Nan Jones and Denny Stults who have completed their time on Session.

The next regular Session meeting will be June 11, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. as part of the Leadership Organizational Conference.



### LEADERSHIP ORGANIZATIONAL CONFERENCE

The next Leadership Organizational Conference is scheduled for Monday, June 11, 2018 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at First Presbyterian Church. An optional light supper will be available at 5:30 p.m. at the church. This conference is for all deacons, trustees and elders who will be serving in 2018-2019, including those who have been newly elected. It is a training, orientation and organizational conference. There will also be time for the separate boards to conduct their regular monthly business meeting.

### BENEVOLENCE REPORT



The Jail Ministry provides religious services for the residents of the Calhoun County Correctional Facility. It is officiated by Chaplain Brent Folkema and funded through the Haven of Rest Ministries. There are up to eight separate worship services conducted in English each Sunday, plus one in Spanish and two in Chinese with the help of volunteers. studies are offered Monday through Friday in the same languages. An additional "Ladder of Recovery" program (based on Romans 7 and 8) is offered weekly to five groups. The Chaplain's office also maintains the jail library and distributes four daily devotions; plus providing counseling services as requested. Special services and additional activities are provided for holidays. The Correctional Facility has some 650 beds and averages around 580 residents (of which about 230 are from Calhoun County, 150 from other municipalities, and 200 are housed for Immigration & Customs Enforcement through rental agreements).





We will begin setup at 11:00AM and need volunteers for this.






