From the Lead Pastor

Dear Friends:

But you should keep a clear mind in every situation. Don't be afraid of suffering for the Lord. Work at telling others the Good News, and fully carry out the ministry God has given you (2 Tim 4:5 NLT).

May 5 will mark a new chapter in the life of First Presbyterian Church. Currently we have three boards at First Presbyterian Church: Deacons, Trustees, and Elders (Session). But on May 5 we will combine the Trustees and Elders into one board so we would end up with two boards: Deacons and Session. Most Presbyterian Churches have gone to this format. It better fits the size of our congregation. It simplifies the structure. It also makes the work of the Nominating Committee more realistic.

The new structure also necessitates a new format for committees and ministry teams of Session. An explanation of terms is in order. A committee studies and recommends policy to Session and manages delegated work. It is led by a chairperson who is currently a member of Session. A ministry team acts to accomplish goals and makes recommendations to Session. It is led by a moderator who is not necessarily a member of Session.

The new committees of Session are: FINANCE COMMITTEE (Formerly Budget, Financial Management); PROPERTY COMMITTEE (Formerly Building Improvement, Facilities, Transportation); and PERSONNEL COMMITTEE.

The ministry teams are: CONNECTION MINISTRY TEAM; DISCIPLESHIP MINISTRY TEAM (Formerly Christian Education & Discipleship); GENEROSITY MINISTRY TEAM (Formerly Stewardship, Planned Giving); MISSION MINISTRY TEAM (Formerly Benevolence Committee); SAFETY MINISTRY TEAM; and WORSHIP MINISTRY TEAM.

The MINISTRY ADVISORY COUNCIL remains to provide advice and counsel to the leadership of the church regarding the health, direction and ministries of the church. The NOMINATING COMMITTEE remains a committee of the Congregation as defined by the Bylaws to nominate one person for each vacant position on the Session, and the Board of Deacons, and for each member at large position on the Nominating Committee.

Presbytery of Lake Michigan The report of the March 16 Presbytery Meeting at Parkwood Jenison was received. The main speaker was Susan Cancro, Executive Director of Advent House Ministries in Lansing. Greenwood Ministries Association is beginning a capital campaign to secure funds to purchase the Camp Greenwood property from our Presbytery.

When you read articles in the Outreach Foundation newsletter you see phrases such as 'Called out of Fear and Into Hope'. "Spending precious days with the church". "My life was changed forever". It became obvious to me that people willing to work with the organization feel blessed, given the opportunity to help. I believe we develop a richer understanding of Gods teachings when we risk the vulnerability of serving.

I haven't heard anyone up here say "How Fargo of you" but "North Dakota nice" is something I've heard a lot – Pastor Homan even used it in a sermon. This book contains dozens of "North Dakota nice" stories – and they're not fairy tales.

We notice the difference in attitude everywhere. Our health care providers are especially kind and thoughtful. And our doctor calls us personally with test results. People are friendly. The teenagers who work at the movie theater chat with us every time we buy tickets. Store clerks are patient and courteous. Neighbors have come down the road and plowed our driveway when they've seen that we're snowed in - and told us to call if we wanted them to do it again. A woman stopped me at a hockey game to tell me how cute my hat was. Everyone knows how to pronounce my name!

It's a whole different mind set up here – people help each other just because they can. I didn't appreciate this kind of community the last time I lived here, but I do now. It's like my church family in Michigan – only bigger!

We're starting to blend in – although Richard's Michigan roots make it a little harder for him. He still yells when a North Dakota nice driver stops to let another car go first.

I hope you enjoy the book. And anytime you'd like to come on up and see what it's like for yourself, I have a spare bedroom.
