#### From the Lead Pastor


#### Dear Friends:

The sermons will be more *Bible Stories for Grown-ups*, like last summer, but will come from the Gospel According to Luke. Preparing for GLORIOUS WORSHIP, which is one of our core values, is something I feel ready to do.

which travels in Arden Hetletvedt and kids at last year's Fair Michigan and Ohio


from the middle of June until the middle of August partnering with congregations to reach out to communities through free health fairs to alleviate suffering and poverty with medical health screenings.

#### Backpack project with Cityling Ministries

What is it? During this annual event, school supplies and backpacks are collected from donation bins set up throughout the community. The supplies are then sorted and packed into backpacks by volunteers, and delivered to local schools to be distributed to children who need them when they return to school in the fall.

We are excited that First Presbyterian will again be site for the donated supplies to be sorted, and packed into backpacks! After very successful campaigns over the last five years, we look forward to participating again this year by using our Mission Focus Funds to purchase backpacks at wholesale prices.

Please note that with area schools starting earlier this year, our project dates have changed, and the sorting and packing activities are being moved to the Youth Center.

Come join us and other volunteers from throughout the community to work together so that area students can begin their school year with the supplies they need to be ready to learn.

#### How you can help:
