Notes from the February Meeting of Session

Carl McCune, Clerk of Session

Session approved the following resolution brought by the Ministry Advisory Council: We, the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Battle Creek, in order to fulfill the goals of the Vision Summit Series, do hereby:

- 1. Reaffirm our adherence to our Mission Statement and Core Values.
- 2. Pledge to follow a Spirit-led, congregation-informed process.
- 3. Commit to a strategy that builds on and refines the Turnaround Cycle (The Turnaround Cycle is drawn from Thom Rainer's book, Scrappy Church, with the terms: Outward Deluge, Welcome Readiness and Backdoor Closure. This is not unlike our previous Action Statement: Go Out, Bring In, Build Up.)

Work is ongoing to implement this strategy.

Acting on Pastor Pat's request to reduce her hours and become a part-time Associate Pastor, a motion prevailed to recommend to the congregation at the February 16 Annual Meeting that her call be changed to part-time and that the Position Description be revised to reflect a workload of thirty hours per week on average.

A motion from the Personnel Committee prevailed to propose for congregational action at the February 16 Annual Meeting the 2020 Terms of Call for Rev. Jeffrey Carlson and Rev. Patricia Weatherwax. These Terms represent a 1.6% salary increase.

Annettie Tribbett, Pete Christ and Mary Maley are working as a Liaison Committee to the Presbytery Committee on Ministry (COM) regarding Pastor Jeff's upcoming retirement December 1. Initial contact has been made with the new COM Moderator, Rev. Troy Hauser-Brydon, who will appoint a transition counselor to work with our church. There have been significant changes in the pastoral search process since we last needed a pastoral search and this Committee is investigating the changes.

It was announced that Pastor Jeff will be going before Presbytery on Saturday September 19 at Spring Lake in the process of dissolving the pastoral relationship and becoming Honorably Retired. The Session would like representatives from the Session and Congregation to attend this meeting in appreciation of Pastor Jeff. We will designate a member from our church to speak at that Presbytery Meeting. A member of Presbytery will also offer words of appreciation.

Membership Update The deaths of Marguerite Dewey on November 18, 2019 and Frederique Klooster on January 20, 2020 were reported. Current Active Membership is 299.

The next regular Session meeting will begin in a joint meeting with the Deacons on March 9, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. in the Parlor.
