We were talking at this time of year – and as would be appropriate in 2023 I said, "Lent is early this year – it arrives in February." He smiled, gave a bemused look, and asked, "Have you ever noticed that Lent and Easter are never

on time? They are either late or early." He was right. We never say, "Easter is right on time this year."

This is your notice that Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, will be February 22<sup>nd</sup> – officially early. We will have a special service that evening, and I encourage you to take advantage of all special services which will occur in this holy season.

This is also a reminder that God's grace manages to move life along in a meaningful way whether we feel God's leading is too slow or too fast at any given moment. We trust God's leading is just what we need when we need it – no matter how it feels. In Isaiah God says to the people who are still in captivity, "In a time of favor I have answered you; on a day of salvation, I have helped you." I suspect some of them were perplexed as they were still in exile. But it was as good as done. Be of good courage. God's grace is sufficient for us no matter the situation. God's work in our lives is always "on time." (Even if Easter isn't)

Paster Offlike

The lack of consistent heating in the Sanctuary and the need for repair of the front doors, which are letting in cold air, were discussed and work is ongoing for solutions.

A **motion** prevailed to eliminate the part-time staff position of Youth Coordinator. Thanks go to Doug McCune who has held that position for many years.

Financial reports through December were made available. Revenue in 2022 exceeded expenses by \$53,812. Of the surplus, \$26,000 will be used as income in the 2023 Annual Budget and the rest of the surplus will go into the Long-Term Capital Fund.

Loren Rex presented the 2023 Annual Budget which has income of \$415,100 (which includes the \$26,000 from the 2022 income) and expenditures of \$405,741. A **motion** prevailed to approve the Budget which will be presented to the congregation at the Annual Meeting to be held on February 19. Besides seeing the Budget and the Annual Report, the congregation will vote on the following change to the Church Bylaws concerning reducing the size of Session:

The ruling elder classes of 2024 & 2025 shall consist of 5 elders each, the class of 2026 shall consist of 4 elders, and thereafter each class shall consist of 4 elders.

## Membership Update

Current Active Membership is 220.

The next regular meeting of Session will be on February 13 at 7:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall.

event this year in an effort to "Keep Christmas" just a little longer.



Traditionally, the Christian church has observed the seven weeks before Easter as a time of penitence and spiritual self-examination.

Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of Lent, derives its name from the ancient practice of marking the foreheads of worshipers with ashes from the unused palm branches of the previous year. Ashes historically have had a dual significance.

First, they are Old Testament symbols of sadness and humility. Job, in the midst of all his troubles, cried out to God from the ash heap.

The second symbolic meaning of ashes is as a reminder of our mortality. Each of us faces the inevitability of physical death. Our bodies and material possessions eventually will turn to dust and ashes. This is a reminder that we dare not trust in things that crumble. But Lent does not leave us on the ash heap. It begins with Ash Wednesday, but ends with Easter. And Easter proclaims that, through Christ, God resurrects us from our dust and ashes, makes us new creatures and brings life out of death!

Our Ash Wednesday Service will be held at 6:30 p.m. on February 22.

### Be Still




